Rural and Urban Scholars in Community Health (RUSCH) is a premed pipeline program designed to select and nurture students who show an interest in practicing medicine in rural and urban underserved areas of Wisconsin. Medically underserved areas in rural and urban Wisconsin are in need of physicians now and the need will continue to grow. The UW School of Medicine and Public Health has created two medical education training programs to address this problem: Wisconsin Academy for Rural Medicine (WARM) and Training in Urban Medicine and Public Health (TRIUMPH).

- US Citizen or Permanent Resident
- Sophomore classification
- 3.0+ Cumulative GPA
- 3.0+ Science (BCPM) GPA
- Demonstrates commitment to community service
- Spend two summers at the school
